#### **NEWS FROM YOUR FINANCIAL SECRETARY**

Do you have any Thrivent Financial products? Do you know that they have a program called Thrivent Choice? This program helps congregations and communities in need. Members can recommend where some of the charitable outreach monies go by directing Choice Dollars and by being involved in voting events. Choice Dollars are determined by insurance premiums, contract values, and Thrivent Financial volunteer leadership. Zion is one of the organizations you can designate your Choice Dollars to. Talk to your Thrivent agent or me for more information.

Zion has a program setup so you can have your weekly, monthly, or bimonthly donation automatically taken out of your checking or savings account. You can sign up for this program anytime, just let me know and I can get you the authorization form to sign. This makes it easier and saves you time and money by not having to write out a check and remember your envelope. To make it easier for you, did you know you can use one check to make multiple donations? For instance, if you give \$10.00 to general fund, \$5.00 to debt & community children, and \$2.00 to Lent you could make out a check for \$17.00 and just write on your envelope the way you wanted it dispersed. That means one check and one envelope. If you have questions please feel free to contact me.

For those of you who have offering envelopes, maybe you have noticed in the back that there is a couple of mailing envelopes for you to use if or when you need to mail in your weekly offering. It is just a time saving element in case you need it. No addressing, just put whatever you need in it, stamp it and you're done.

## **Council Meeting Summary\_**

**PASTOR'S REPORT:** The report noted January Attendance: 127 in 2013, 117 in 2012, 115 in 2011, 131 in 2010, and 120 in 2009.

**INTERN'S REPORT:** The first Communion classes for children in K-5 will begin the first Sunday in March. Eleven children have now signed up.

JANUARY FINANCIAL REPORTS: John reported the General Fund/ Parsonage combined fund balances decreased \$2,594 with \$594 transferred from the Parsonage Proceeds Fund to avoid a negative General Fund Balance on January 31, 2013. A \$3,050 final insurance payment is due in February. The Capital Campaign Fund balance decreased \$1,259 to \$24,445. The only expenditure is for the monthly loan payment. The Capital Improvement Fund Balance increased \$16 to \$34,155 with \$446 of the fund balance available for a future roof loan payment. Debt and Community Children had receipts of \$1,644 with disbursements of \$164 to Synod, \$329 to DAR and \$822 to Thrivent for the extra principal payment. Thrivent loan balance was \$36,902 per the Thrivent statement after the scheduled 1/15/13 payment; this does take into account the \$822 principal payment at the end of January; estimated January 31st balance is \$36,080.

<u>EVANGELISM</u>: Peter Thielen announced that he has had conversations with Rob Lund, owner of Shooby's Trophies and Apparel, regarding the signs that Zion hopes to have installed in the building. Pam and Rob are providing all of the necessary signs at no cost to Zion.

Standing Committee and Assignments: Each Council member selected a standing committee for which they will act as liaisons. In the coming month, members were asked to ponder the viability of each of those committees and at the next Council meeting there will be an open discussion regarding our findings. ...(continued)

Upcoming Visit from Pastor Lameck Byonge: Pastor Byonge, Pastor Keith's contact person during his first three weeks in Tanzania, has informed Pastor Keith that he would like to visit from December 22, 2013 to January 3, 2014. Since he is not familiar with either our weather or our Christmas traditions, this will be very interesting for all. Pastor Keith also mentioned that normally a congregation contributes spending money and felt that about \$500 would be appropriate. The Council agreed to write a letter formally inviting Pastor Lameck Byonge to visit Marinette from December 22, 2013-January 3, 2014 on behalf of Zion Lutheran Church and it was agreed that we would hold a special fund raiser to contribute \$500 to Pastor Byonge for spending money.

Gary Grom and Dave Ramsey's Financial Planning: Gary G. shared information on David Ramsey's Financial Peace University. The program would be done as outreach to our congregation and community. The same program is currently being sponsored at Faith Baptist in Peshtigo and the Council is being asked to consider providing this opportunity here at Zion as well. A discussion regarding this program will take place at the March meeting after the Council has had sufficient time to investigate the website.

#### Stewards of God's Abundance

Vibrant stewards embrace financial health as an expression of faith. We allow money to flow to and through our lives in ways that nourish us and our world. We recognize that our capacity to give is defined by our hearts, not our pocketbooks.

Personal finances can be a touchy subject, so I feel it's important to say upfront that there is no judgment intended in this article. We are each in different places financially for different reasons. Many among us are struggling financially, and the causes may be of our own doing or may be due to a misfortune over which we had no control. Others among us have more than sufficient financial resources.

Money and even wealth is not in itself bad, no more than food is bad. The biblical prophets rail against the rich, not specifically because they are rich, but because they are rich and oblivious. The rich man in Jesus' parable in Luke 16:19-31 is doomed to eternal torment because he was luxuriously rich and completely oblivious to the destitute Lazarus lying just outside. One wonders how things would have turned out if just one of those at the rich man's feast had called his attention to the poor man at the gate.

Over the past several years, I have been fortunate to work in a community foundation. Through extensive study of private, community and corporate foundations, I have come to understand and appreciate the great things that have been and are being accomplished when people use their wealth for the good of all.

There are countless real-life examples of allowing money to flow to and through our lives in ways that nourish us and our world. The challenge for us imperfect humans, wherever we are on the spectrum, is to maintain a balanced relationship with money.

God calls us to be disciples as whole persons, all the time, engaged in all aspects of life on earth. And in this day and age, life on earth involves money. Our personal financial health is an important dimension of our overall health in faith. To put our finances in order, we have to order our lives and priorities, as well.

Craig Ford is a former missionary who shares thoughts on debt-free living, frugality, generous giving and simple living. He explained, "As I look into financial issues, the more I realize it is about more than math. In fact, I've been surprised how often the emotional and spiritual components of a financial decision outweigh the mathematical."

Personal financial health is best achieved in the same way as personal physical health: develop good daily habits and have an annual check-up. Good habits include basics like preparing a budget so that we live within our means, saving, giving, paying debts on time and continuing to learn about financial issues.

Our annual financial check-up includes making a personal balance sheet. We record all the details of personal assets: bank accounts, investments, retirement accounts, real estate, cars and furnishings. Then we record all the details of personal liabilities: credit card debt, mortgage and student loan debt. Does the ratio of debt-to-assets indicate that we are living within our means? We review property and life insurance coverage to ensure that it is accurate and adequate. Have we developed the discipline of saving for emergencies as well as saving for retirement? At any stage in our lives, we should have a will and/or estate plan that provides for any dependents and distributes our assets in a positive manner. ....(continued)

What if our financial health isn't good? Fortunately, there are many resources to help us get on track.

Our personal financial health matters. Being financially healthy frees us to live a productive and joyful life in service to God. We are stewards, on behalf of God, of all that we have and all that we are. Stewardship is not a program. It is a way of life!

### Lenten Prayer Journey




