The Stewardship Corner_

My goal for this article is to point out what I have often heard and now believe, that our contributions to Zion, both monetarily and through time and talents, are a reflection on our faith.

You know from past articles that I have written that Jesus' discussions on money always focused on the fact that what a believer does with his or her money impacts that person's faith. Jesus was convinced that money has the capacity to lead a person's heart to Him, and money has the capacity to lead a person's heart away from Him.

I feel it's important to say upfront that it is not my intention to be judgmental. Each of us is in a different place financially and for different reasons. Many are struggling financially; the causes may be of our own doing or may be due to a misfortune over which we had no control. Others among us have more than sufficient financial resources. What I am going to attempt to do is share with you my own story and my correlation about faith and finances.

I joined Zion Lutheran in March of 1980. I needed a church and wanted our son to learn about Christ. I thought I was a reasonably good Christian even though my attendance at worship was quite irregular and the funds I provided were miniscule at best. I base that statement on the fact that I was paying Zion for services rendered to me and my family; my contributions ranged from a low of \$5.00 to a high of \$20.00 per week.

It took until October 1995 for those beliefs to start changing. I was diagnosed with Ovarian Cancer and from that moment on my Christian metamorphosis started. I absolutely had to attend worship and I listened, truly listened to the service and the sermon. I actually started to read and learn more about the Bible. I wanted to familiarize myself with the foundations of the Lutheran faith. Frankly, I felt like a Christian in training. In the beginning of my metamorphosis you couldn't shut me up; I was committed to telling my story, but God had just started with me. ...(continued)

I became a member of the Stewardship Committee, and that's where I really started to grow and bloom. It was through my readings on that committee that I truly felt in my own heart that as a Christian everything belongs to God, and that he entrusted some of what he has to me. I came to understand that he trusts me to care for those things; he made me his steward. Pastor Keith has told us that again and again, but hearing it and believing it in the depths of your soul are two very different things. I knew Christians were asked to tithe 10% of their income, and I knew I wanted God to think of me as a good Christian. So one year, I decided to just do it. I would start tithing, and I would trust God to make it work. My giving jumped substantially, and God continued to provide. I didn't suffer — I thrived. I felt wonderful – I was blessed.

It is now 19 years later and I continue to grow by participating in the life of this congregation and its members, through Pastor Keith's leadership, and by attending Bible studies and Lay School for Mission classes. I feel God isn't done with me yet. I rely on his Holy Spirit to lead and guide me daily, and I pray I am helping others to grow in their journey with him. I have been blessed beyond measure.

The goal of stewardship ministry is to help God's people grow in their relationship with Jesus through the use of the time, talents, and finances God has entrusted to them. We do this by utilizing sound financial practices and by using our time and talents in ways that are pleasing to God.

I know the Stewardship Committee accomplished its goal with me. I wish each member of Zion could participate on the Stewardship Committee. I have learned so much through the committee over the last nine or ten years. Its various members have and continue still to open my eyes and teach me, to feel and accept God's love, and to trust him above all else.

I readily admit that my faith in my Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, has grown over these nineteen years. I feel it deep within my heart and I discovered it anew as I reviewed my checkbook and my level of giving.

Summary Council Meeting Wednesday, January 15, 2014 (Changed from January 14 due to inclement weather)

December attendance was up from 2012 from 120 to 124. Pastor Keith noted that Zion appears to be just maintaining its attendance. Christmas Eve attendance was down from 2012 from 195 to 162. Funerals were held for: Eunice Garant on November 3, Sharon Huntley on December 4, Carolyn Jensen on December 19, and Gary Shultz on December 31. Pastor Keith will be attending the Synod Council meeting in Marquette at the end of January. In February, he will attend the Synod Leaders Event at Fortune Lake. The speaker will be Elizabeth Eaton, the new ELCA Bishop.

The reports from Karen Houdek were reviewed. Pastor Keith noted that the monies in envelopes showed an increase in giving for 2013 over 2012 by \$3,155.32. John's report noted that the General Fund/ Parsonage combined fund balances increased \$5,804 from \$2,130 to \$7,934. Pastor Keith explained this is very significant since it relates to Zion's cash flow. Contributions and receipts for the General Fund show an uptake in giving. He also shared that the 2nd Mile Campaign and Debt/DAR have done very well this year. Debt/DAR and Community Children had receipts of \$1,744. Disbursements of \$174 to Synod, \$349 to DAR, \$2,512 to Fortune Lake and \$872 to Thrivent for the extra loan principal payment. \$800 is available for community scholarships to Fortune Lake. The Capital Campaign fund balance decreased \$1,262 from \$13,103 to \$11,841. Zion's loan of \$175,000 should be paid off by February and this only took 7 years - an outstanding accomplishment.

The Property Committee reported a new water heater for the kitchen sinks was purchased and will be installed soon. The new door for the usher's closet has been shortened and is ready to be hung.

The Personnel Committee completed annual reviews for staff members and made recommendations for salary increases.

Council accepted the committee's recommendations to increase salaries as presented. ...(continued)

Pastor Keith reviewed the 2014 budget and noted the 2014 figures represent a tight, conservative budget at \$186,673 compared to 2013's actual figure of \$199,397. Estimated total donations amount to \$188,993, including \$171,893 for general fund donations based on what was given in 2013. The budget includes the Personnel Committee's proposal for staff salary increases. Pastor requested that a donation of \$100 for the Relay for Life team be included in the budget. This amounts to a very balanced and conservative budget, with more income than expenditures. Pastor Keith stated he has never seen this. Council approved the 2014 budget as amended, and will recommend it at the Annual Meeting.

Amanda noted that the initial pre-course meetings for the Dave Ramsey course are going well and 6-7 people are currently signed up to attend.

A Council Retreat is set for March 7-8 at FLLC at a cost of \$45-\$50/person. This will be discussed at the February meeting.

Council approved the amended January 26th Annual Meeting agenda, with the addition of an Education Report.

Council approved the Resolutions to be presented at the Annual Meeting.

Gail Melgary's membership transfer to Zion was approved by Council.

Council approved obtaining a new credit card since the current card is unusable and needed for purchasing supplies and maintenance items for Zion.

Council terms for Karen, Bryan, Kathy, and Jacki have expired. All noted that their time on Council was meaningful and rewarding. Karen and Kathy both served for 6 years. Jacki served for 3 years, and has served several times in the past, and Bryan was filling in for a one year term. He has served on the Zion's Council in the past.

The next Council meeting will be February 11, 2014 at 6:30 p.m.

Be it also resolved that we the congregation encourage and support their work in and through Zion Lutheran Church. Pastor Keith received a standing ovation after the Resolution was accepted.

Pastor Keith installed the new members of the Council and we closed with prayer.


