Our Discipleship Together Unpredictable Easter

Thanks to the internet, I came across a chart that lists 600 years of dates for Easter, from 1700 to 2299. Being a church geek, I found the list interesting.

For instance: There are 35 possible dates for Easter. Within those 600 years, the most popular date for Easter is April 16th, and, ironically, that's the date for Easter next year. The second most popular dates for Easter is a tie between April 11th and March 31st. The least popular date is March 24th. It

fell on that date only twice in that 600 year span, and it won't be occurring again until after 2299.

March 22nd is the earliest date for Easter. The last time Easter was on March 22nd was in 1818, and the next time it will be on that day is 2285. The last time Easter was on March 27th, (the day we celebrate Easter this year), or earlier was in 2008 when Easter fell on March 23rd. The next time that Easter will be in the month of March will be 2024, and the next time it will be this early or earlier will be in 2035!

The latest that Easter can be is April 25th. The last time Easter was on that date was in 1943. The next time it will occur on that date will be 2038.

So, how is the date of Easter determined? Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday after (never on) the Paschal full moon; that being the first full moon occurring on or after the spring equinox.

I love how unpredictable the date of Easter can be. It is a type of parable, expressing how unpredictable Christ can be when he enters into our lives. Just when we think we've got things all figured out, bam!, Christ shows up unexpectedly, blessing us and guiding us on his way. Sometimes it's earlier than we expect. Sometimes it's later, but rarely does it occur when we expect it to. This makes the journey of faith so interesting. - - - And I've come full circle. *Pastor Keith*

Several weeks ago, a friend sent me a You Tube video featuring Steve Harvey, the television game show host of Family Feud. One day after filming the show, Mr. Harvey addressed his audience. This is a very small part of what he shared with them. "You cannot just exist in this life. God, when he created all of us, he gave every last one of us a gift at birth. He never created a soul without endowing them with a gift.... You've got to identify that gift. Have you identified that gift?"

The gifts God has given you and your ability to share those gifts with others is what allows Zion to consistently follow through on so much of its mission. Last month, I presented the standing committees of Zion. This month, I'm telling you about its ministry teams. Look closely at them and see if you can't utilize your gift to help make one of them stronger.

The *Git-R-Done* team is a branch of the Property Committee. In 2015, this group of individuals helped to install a massive amount of new lights in the building and as a result saved Zion over \$1,000. That savings allowed us to replace the lighting in the kitchen. This group of hearty souls is headed by Gary Grom.

The *Sew for Missions* group meets the second and fourth Tuesdays from 9-11:30 a.m. in Zion's Fellowship Hall. They produce a fairly large quantity of quilts which are shipped to ministries overseas as part of Lutheran World Relief. If you can run a sewing machine, great! If you can't, that's ok too. They need those who can pin fabric together and tie knots in yarn as well.

Zion's Caring Ministry Team ministers to the homebound, elderly, and the ill. These visits generally take place once a month at a time convenient for the visitor and the person being visited. Some members visit. Others deliver Holy Communion. The only prerequisite is having a loving and caring attitude for people. The team leader is Karen Sylvester.

GOOD NEWS FOR IRA CHARITABLE ROLLOVERS!

In December, 2015, the House and Senate passed the Protecting Americans from Tax Hikes (PATH) Act, and President Obama signed the Act. The Act makes permanent charitable giving tax incentives which had expired January 1, 2015, including the IRA charitable rollover.

The Act permanently extends the provision for individuals age 70½ and older to be allowed to make tax-free distributions from individual retirement accounts (IRAs) to a qualified charitable organization. The treatment continues to be capped at a maximum of \$100,000 per taxpayer each year. An IRA rollover is a tax-exempt distribution from the IRA. The amount transferred can be used to meet the donor's required minimum distribution. Amounts in excess of \$100,000 must be included in income but may be taken as an itemized charitable deduction, subject to the usual AGI annual caps for contributions.

Note that the bill makes the IRA rollover permanent. Permanency is important as the rollover is now a certainty. You will be in a better position to manage your income as well as your charitable giving. The bill also makes the IRA rollover retroactive to December 31, 2014. Gifts transferred directly from an IRA to a charitable organization at any point during 2015 (as well as in 2016 going forward) will qualify as a rollover gift.

If you might qualify, be sure to contact your financial advisor to find out how to make this possible and how it might benefit you.

"Zion's Week at Camp"



Scholarships for Zion's members

Zion offers a 50% scholarship for Zion campers having their first experience at camp. For veteran campers, Zion offers a 25% scholarship. The percentage is based on the final registration fee which includes any eligible discounts.

A scholarship form, that Zion has copies of, or it can be downloaded from the Fortune Lake website, must be filled out by both the family and Zion and sent to Fortune Lake Lutheran Camp prior to sending in the final camp payment, and/or at least two weeks prior to attending camp. Community Scholarships for Fortune Lake Camp – Can We Send 10 Kids This Year?

Once again, Zion will be seeking recipients of scholarships to pay the whole registration fee for an entire week of camp at Fortune Lake. In 2012 we awarded scholarships to three children. In 2013 the number jumped to six children. In 2014 it dropped back down to 3 scholarships. The number for 2015 came up a little with 5 scholarships awarded, with one of those used for Victory Camp, a week for adults with special needs. Zion collected enough money in 2015 to support at least another five children. The good news is that the extra money collected was sent to Fortune Lake to be used for its scholarship program this year.

In 2012 -15, all the scholarship applications and awards came from friends and close acquaintances of Zion's members. This has been wonderful, and we certainly want to see it continue! You are a powerful force for evangelism in our community! Please be sure to keep up the good work! Application packets will be available on the nametag table in the lobby starting Sunday, February 28th. Applications need to be returned by Monday, March 28th, in order to take advantage of early registration discounts. Please continue to encourage your friends, relatives and neighbors to apply!

We will also once again distribute our application packets to DAR Boys and Girls Club and children in our Cub Scout group. We will also be in contact with the Marinette school social worker and homeless grant coordinator to look for deserving candidates. Along with your great generosity in supporting this wonderful program, we ask for your prayers that the work we do here, combined with the powerful experience that Fortune Lake provides, will help children in our community recognize the love of Christ that surrounds them, encouraging them to grow in faith.

Souper Bowl Hunger Drive








