



completed application (and essay) to Zion by Monday, March 14th. Scholarship winners will be announced on Sunday, March 20th during our worship.


Indoor in-person worship: March 2, 2022


Indoor services will be held every other Sunday. Outdoor services will alternate with these indoor services. (If an outdoor service is canceled because of weather, indoor worship will be available, first-come, first-served.) At this time, Zion is no longer requiring you to reserve a pew for the in-person indoor worship. However, it is subject to change and is dependent upon the positive test rate, cases per 100,000 and the probability rate. Social distancing practices will continue to be used (no passing of the peace or offering plate, limited & soft singing). Please visit Zion's website to read the Protocols for In-Person Indoor Worship - all adults in attendance are required to wear a mask that covers the nose and mouth (the exception being Pastor who is leading worship). At this time, we acknowledge that there is some risk involved. Even though our local total population is 53.77% vaccinated which surpasses our safer goal of 50%; our 65+ age group is over our safe goal at 88.87%. The 18 & up vaccinated average is currently at 62.60%. For unknown reasons, the vaccination rate for Menominee County dropped between February 23 and March 2. This caused the averages to decrease, but they all remain above our goal. We are also watching the test positivity rate. Our area's positivity rate is 5.46%, which is below our goal. Cases per 100,000 is low but continues to be above our goal. Another measurement is a percentage of probability where, in a random gathering of 50 people, how likely is it that someone with COVID-19 would be present. Right now, there is a 31.67% chance of this happening. We feel that everyone's knowledge of the risk is important. We are publishing graphs in the weekly announcements that represent the average numbers of the following Counties: Oconto, Marinette and Menominee, MI. We are watching the trend of each graph with what are considered to be safer and safe goals in mind. The data used in the graphs are collected from the CDC website and from a website tool provided to us from our Northern Great Lakes Synod. Please make the time to familiarize yourself with the graphs/information. Should you have concerns, questions or comments, please do not hesitate to contact Zion's office.









World Hunger Buzz

We really are a part of something awesome. The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) works tirelessly to address hunger all over the world.

Immediate relief is provided to those who are hungry and basic needs are met. But it doesn't stop there. People are connected with resources so they can produce food, access clean water,



get educated, start a business, receive health care, encourage their neighbors, and strengthen their communities.

It starts with relationships and conversations. Folks know the needs in their own communities. The ELCA listens and responds as partners. Our support of these ministries is what will help change the systems that perpetuate poverty. Together, we can achieve things on a scale and scope that we never could do otherwise.

The first Sunday in Lent is March 6th. We'll have a Temple Talk that day from Zion's Social Ministry Committee and begin collecting donations to support these ministries. We'll complete our collection on Easter Sunday, April 17th. Zion will pass this gift along when our synod assembles in May.

We're going to track our fund progress with bees this year. For every ten dollars we receive to alleviate hunger we'll add a bee to our honeycomb. We're ready with 300 bees but if we collect more than \$3,000 the committee is very happy to make more bees! In the process of reporting our progress we'll tell you how interesting bees are and how important they are to agriculture.

The world produces more food today than it has at any point in human history – more than enough to feed every person – but the number of people experiencing hunger is growing. As members of the ELCA, we are called to respond. We are a church that rolls up our sleeves and gets to work. Please give what you can. Thank you!

Mobile Food Pantry

The Marinette Salivation Army will be hosting a Feeding America Mobile Food Pantry March 17 at 10 a.m. A Mobile Food Pantry contains 15,000 pounds of food sent on a truck in order to provide food for 300 households in need, on a first come first serve basis.

The Mobile Pantry will be located in Menominee at Spies Public Library and will continue to be a drive-through process. Set up and volunteer check in will start at 8 a.m. with distribution beginning at 10. All new volunteers will be asked to sign a waiver.
