He served as Pastor to Grace Lutheran Church, Pembine for 10 years, retiring in September 2013. Since then, he served as Interim Pastor for St. Stephen's Lutheran Church, Stephenson and Gethsemane Lutheran Church in Wallace and provided pulpit supply for area congregations. Pastor Gene and Carol are enjoying retirement on Beecher Lake.

## September "Stepping in Faith" Initiative

September is a month for new beginnings – the Green Bay Packers' new season is underway, many children will be attending freshly renovated schools with new school supplies in hand, and organizations are planning fall events that they hope will be interesting, informative, and fun.

Zion, too, is busy planning. Beginning September 11th through October 23rd we will continue our yearlong stewardship initiative by focusing on GIVE, one of the Seven Marks of Discipleship. September 11th will be our Kick-Off Sunday. On that Sunday, we will hand out the Steps in Faith through GIVE suggestion list which we ask you to affix to your refrigerator with the Stepping in Faith magnet, and faithfully consider in the weeks ahead.

- On September 18, Michelle Larson will present the first of three Temple Talks on the themes of Time, Talents, and Treasures. We have invited her to speak on Time as she donates a huge number of hours to Zion, and in most cases, without being asked.


### **Confirmation**
