"Hi – for those of you who don't know me, I am Karen Dill and have been a member of Zion since our family moved here from Delaware in 1979. My children were raised here at Zion, and I have been active on several committees throughout the years.

"When Karen Sylvester approached me in August about doing a Temple Talk on Treasures, and whether or not I am a cheerful giver, I thought this is way out of my comfort level! She said she and Pastor Doug thought I would do a good job on this and to just pray about it. I was thinking, "yea right", but I would give it a shot. Later that day. I was walking our schnauzer, Libbi, around the church block, which we do most every day and the hymn - 'We give thee but thine own, whatever the gift may be, because all we have is thine alone, a trust O Lord, from thee.' I was thinking, ok, God, you have given me a start! I started looking at our beautiful church building and grounds and all that happens here. It reminded me of the finger play we all learned as children - here is the church, here is the steeple, open the doors, and see all the people! We here at Zion are blessed with a wonderful church family who love to give hugs, who step up when a need arises - from giving rides and picking up groceries to those who aren't able to get out, baking bars for Community Concerts, contributing to food pantries and our current God's Work, Our Hands project for the Police, Firemen and EMT's. Fortune Lake, DAR, World Hunger, the boiler fund and our bell, which apparently has a mind of its own! We are able to provide funeral lunches, offer a space to the Boy Scouts, the Red Cross, and maintain a Harvest of Hope Garden, plus a host of other activities, from choir, Sew for Missions, and Spark, and others I know I have forgotten.

"So am I blessed with lots of treasures and am I a cheerful giver, you bet and so are all of you. While I am grateful for the opportunities God gives me to support these ministries with my time and abilities, I am especially grateful that God gives us the privilege of supporting the work of the church with our financial resources. Lanse and I donate our offering electronically and once we got used to that system and not putting an envelope in the offering plate – a little hard to get used to at first, I find joy in knowing that our financial support is helping these ministries happen. My children had a wonderful start to their faith life here at Zion and my hope, is that we are able to give the young people growing up in this congregation and those in future generations these same experiences and special friendships that we share now.

"In closing, if any of you are asked to give a similar message, you are welcome to borrow Libbi, take her for a walk around the church block, and let God write your Temple Talk for you! Thank you."
