From the Pastor's Desk

What a joy it was to worship with the Emmanuel family and their guests on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day! What a blessing to celebrate together the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ! I look forward to one more Sunday of Christmas celebration on January 1, New Year's Day. This service will once again include several of our favorite Christmas hymns and carols, some we sang last weekend and some we have not yet sung. What better way to usher in a new year than to honor our God and Lord in word, song and

sacrament. Christmas may be the shortest season of the Church Year, but its message stays with us and blesses our lives every day in all the seasons of our lives.

I have served as Zion's Interim Pastor for the past eight months. It has been my privilege to not only worship with you most Sundays, but to work with the most faithful, dedicated members. Zion is blessed with a wonderful staff, dedicated leaders and faithful volunteers who so willingly take responsibility to serve and carry on the work of the church. Working with the Congregation Council and several committees and task forces, I am assured that Zion is in good hands.

Now we are about to embark on a new year of doing our Lord's work together. We have been intentional up to this point of not rushing into the process of calling a new pastor. When a congregation has been served faithfully and effectively for as many years as Pastor Kolstad served you as a beloved and trusted pastor, it is important to take time to process your loss—yes, to grieve—and reflect on the blessings and benefits of that long ministry. It is also important to take time to reflect on the progress of the church's mission and ministries leading up to the present, to assess the congregation's assets and needs, and

determine how you want to move forward. I feel that this has been accomplished in the past eight months.

It is now time to dig in to the process of calling a new pastor who will serve Zion congregation and direct its mission and ministry in the coming years. In consultation with me, Congregation President Troy Cording has assembled a Transition Task Force made up of himself, Shawn Limberg, Rachel Rosenfedlt, Laura Rowe, Karen Sylvester and Jonah Zuehls. This is a diverse group of members representing various ages, years of membership, and areas of involvement. Thank you to these dedicated members for consenting to service. Their task will be to oversee what is called the Mission Site Evaluation. They will pour through the materials provided by Bishop Finegan and gather the information about Zion's history, statistics, demographics, and goals for the future. When completed, with the input of many of Zion's members, this comprehensive report will be placed in the hands of Bishop Finegan to help her in identifying candidates for a pastoral call that best fits Zion's profile. I will be consulting with the task force to guide them through the process. I ask that you hold these members in your prayers, asking for the Holy Spirit to guide them in their task.

As we move together into a new year, I offer you a benediction from Paul's letter to the Romans consistent with my Christmas message to the congregation: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

The congregational council met **OUNCIL** December 13th, 2022 at 6:30 pm.

PDATES Pastors Report: Communion visits complete for the month. Confirmation has gone well. Sent a mid-year report to the families of the confirmands to let them know what to expect.

Looking forward to Christmas services with us. Sub-pastors list is ready for the coming months, blessed to have sufficient back-up. The November Council minutes were approved. An adjustment was made to the minutes that a \$900 Energy Start rebate was applied for, but not received in November. This reflects the estimated amount which will be applied to the balance of the boiler.

Financial Update: LeeAnn Martin presented her notes. Troy Cording and LeeAnn will review the current state of the invoices to ensure we haven't paid for services not rendered. WPS installed a new meter which will change our bills going forward. Using online banking will make additional payments on the loan to bring down the balance.

Committee Reports

Property: Rekeying the church, Mark dropped off the new keys and will change over to the new keys on December 30. Will come up with a form for Marissa to have people fill out when they are assigned a key or want to 'check out' a key. Therefore, it will be documented where the keys have been distributed. Will begin distributing the keys between now and then by determining who should have keys. New keys will not be able to be copied. **Worship & Music:** Proposing improving video equipment to upgrade equipment. Video, switcher, cable management. Recommend to ask a technician from Northern Sounds & Video to come and assess the situation.

Youth Ministry: There has not been a lot of activity with the Youth account, made a \$500 donation during the Brat Fry fundraiser for Fortune Lake, matched funds from CoVantage Credit Union.

Stewardship & Generosity: Planned giving pledge information was submitted by Karen Houdek.

Personnel: Minutes were presented. Staff evaluations have been completed, thanking and affirming employees. Received forms back, and personally addressing. Recommend a 6% increase for all employees except for Pastor Schoen

Mission Endowment Fund: St. Vincent DePaul and Town of Peshtigo Fire Department will come in to do a Temple Talk to discuss how they used their funds.

Safety & Security Taskforce: Working to get the main door to the North secured. Researched the system used at local school which includes cameras and a buzzer system to allow guests

Old Business

Transition Task Force: Jonah, Laura, Troy, Rachel Rosenfeld, Karen Sylvester, Shawn Limberg will start meeting the first of the year on Sundays. January 8 will be first meeting. Will work together to fill out the packet from the synod.

MMACF Future Fund: Tabled

Budget Draft: Choir directors will be paid monthly in 2023. Putting an estimate together for future Pastor salary, housing, insurance to make the amount fair going forward. Discussed preliminary budget with some changes made. Consider in the future using excess in General Fund to pay more on the Boiler Loan. Discontinue Call Fund. Repurpose Parsonage Proceeds to Bell Fund. Recommend a 6% increase for all employees. Will receive a final draft for approval at January meeting.

New Business

Boy Scout Troops 1017 6017 Charter: Contacted Troy to charter a Boy Scout Troop, similar to the Cub Scouts Pack 4068. There is no charge, or minimal charge to charter. We give them a place to gather, may also grant them the use of our tax exempt number to purchase supplies. Would like to know what liability we hold as a charter. Would like to do a lock-in on December 20, this would be separate from the charter.

The next council meeting will be January 10th at 6:30 p.m. The Annual Meeting is set for January 29. 2023.

The goal of Zion's Stewardship and Generosity Committee is to help God's people grow in their relationship with Jesus through the use of the time, talents, and finances God has entrusted to them. The next seven-weeks of the Stewardship and Generosity Committee's year-round stewardship emphasis will be focused on Invite. Zion's Vision Statement for "Invite" is: "In light of the many unique gifts that God has graciously entrusted to Zion, we envision a congregation that invites others to participate in the life of the congregation by training its members to actively encourage those who are not connected with a congregation to participate in what Jesus is doing through Zion, warmly welcoming them and enthusiastically involving them in the mission work we do together as God's children."

I'll admit this mark is really a tough one for me. When at worship, I can usually walk up to a complete stranger and start a conversation or invite someone to come to Coffee Hour if we have one that Sunday and then sit with them if I'm able. I'm also great at inviting people to a gathering. I can easily invite someone to a concert or a performance at Theater on the Bay. What I'm not good at is asking someone to come to worship with me – not even my own family!! How can I overcome this problem, this fear?

I've been told that the first time you do something is always the hardest. If you keep it up it'll get easier. Perhaps I'm terrified they'll tell me to forget it; it's boring; it takes too much time; or they have better things to do. They may say they get nothing out of it so why even bother. Those excuses sound much like the excuses I used myself when I would decide not to attend worship ages ago.

Today, worship and Christian interaction are so important to me, I've no idea why it wasn't before. My heart was hardened even though God was always walking with me.

Some realize this need for communing with God early in life and others, like me, must have a life altering experience before the Holy Spirit can enter in and make changes.

So back to inviting people to Zion. I received an assist from Bonnie Schoen, another member of this committee. She shared some random thoughts that I thought were fabulous.

She said, "Invitations are just the beginning of planning for an event...should be the easiest part, but we often make inviting hard...there is always a fear of rejection for a variety of reasons... we should think of inviting someone to church as the easiest part...that's all we have to do...just invite and then Let Go and Let God! ...the Holy Spirit does the rest of the work."

"Sometimes we have to invite repeatedly....don't give up...let the Holy Spirit take care of the rest." Another thought she offered was to use written invitations. What might happen if every member invited someone, with an oral or a written invitation? Wouldn't that be wonderful and exciting?

Bonnie offers sage words of wisdom, and I'm so thankful for her insight. I invite you, and I pray to God that I, when the opportunity presents itself invite someone to share in the joy by attending worship with us.

Matthew 11:28-30 "Come to me, all who are weary and heavyladen, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

May God grant each of you health, happiness, and prosperity in 2023.
