"Stepping in Faith" Stewardship Initiative

This month's stewardship focus is on study. It sounds so easy right? Sitting here in my house without others to guide my study and offer their opinions on the text, I find it isn't easy at all.

I did a search to get some tips on studying the Bible. Here's what I found.

- 1. Begin your study with prayer seeking wisdom and understanding.
- 2. You don't have to start at the beginning. The Gospels are easier to understand than Daniel or Revelations.
- Choose a topic relevant to you and your life grace, repentance, forgiveness, or strength.
- 4. Get to know a character John the Baptist, Moses, Mary Magdalen.
- 5. Write down the insights you glean while doing your individual study.
- 6. Read the same Bible verses in different versions of the Bible.
- 7. Read or share with a family member or friend via Zoom, Facetime, or email.
- 8. Look up what you don't understand. Some of the words in the Bible are not easy. With the Internet we have a plethora of insights available to us.
- 9. Pause and listen. It is important to search and study the word of God, but it is equally important to slow down, quiet your mind, and listen.

Learning from the Bible is a lifelong pursuit and one which pleases God.

Dear Lord, we know you want us to learn more about you, your kingdom, and your love. Place within our hearts a desire to take time with your word in the Bible and to read and contemplate it. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen. Karen Sylvester
