### From the Pastor's Desk

At the Annual Congregation Meeting, the voting members approved an operating budget for 2024. The first item in the budget is Synod benevolence. That is as it should be. If we are to encourage one another to practice proportionate, first fruits giving, i.e., putting God first in our financial planning, then we, as a congregation, should do the same in regard to benevolence. In fact, we give 11% of our budget to Synod benevolence as a first fruits gift. We should keep in mind that benevolence is not just a donation we send to the Synod. It is money given in support of the mission of the church we do together with all the congregations of our Synod. In other words, it is a gift to ourselves. The root meaning of the word "synod" is "walking together." So, the Synod is not THEM. The Synod is US.

Recently, Bishop Finegan sent us a letter thanking us for our support of the work we did together in 2023. She said, "I am grateful to you for doing what you can to fulfill the commitment you made to the work of Christ in and through the Northern Great Lakes Synod." She then provided the following information I would like to share with you:

- The work of Pastor Jim Duehring which includes Faithful Innovations, Stewardship education, transition support, committee leadership: Companion Synod relations, Youth, Walking with Our Indigenous Neighbors, U.P. Wild, and more.
- The work of Deacon Lori Ward to organize Lifelong Faith Formation and administer the Licensed Lay Minister evaluations.
- The work of Stefanie Ehle as our Synod Youth Coordinator to organize conference youth events, the 2024 Youth Gathering, and conference collaborations for youth fellowship and education.

- The work of Courtney Wehmeier coordinating information, registrations, and generating communications through E Notes, the Northern Light, the website, and more.
- Providing the necessities of heat, staff, salary, travel expenses, and lights to keep the Synod office functioning and effective.
- Support of Lutheran Campus Ministry, Seminary support at Wartburg Seminary and Lutheran School of Theology Chicago, Synod Council and more.

Also, almost half of the offerings that you gave to the Synod were forwarded to the ELCA. Your offerings support Global Mission, pastoral leader development, advocacy, Women of the ELCA, new church start-ups, missionaries and more.

What a blessing it is to us to know that a portion of the offerings we give have such a far-reaching effect! As one congregation alone, our outreach would be very limited. But "walking together" with congregations throughout the U.P. and northeastern Wisconsin, as well as congregations throughout the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, we can do great things to build up the kingdom of God in our community, our nation and the world. Thanks be to God for this privilege and opportunity! Thanks be to God for the generosity of our Zion members who support these wonderful ministries!

#### **ANNUAL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS**

Forty-six voting members attended the Annual Congregational Meeting in Zion's Social Hall last Sunday, nearly twice the number required for a quorum. As a first order of business, the members elected the following persons to leadership positions: Laura Rowe to a second 3-year term on the Congregation Council; Phil Strohl and Tatem Schroeder to 3-year terms on the Council; Sophie Limburg to a 1-year term as youth member; Karen Dill to second 3-year terms on the Personnel Committee and the Mission Endowment Committee; Kathy Heimbuch, Cheryl Maxwell, Debbie Mylener for two-year terms and Kathi Gutknecht to a 1-year term on the Nominating Committee. Outgoing Council members Troy Cording, Kim Graf and Henry Zuehls were thanked and commended for their service.

The members adopted an operating budget of \$245,456 for 2024. This includes \$45,482 (based on quotes) for upgrading our A/V system to enhance the projection of our worship services both on the screen and on Facebook Live, as well as for recording and projecting, weddings, funerals and other special events. This amount is offset by the AV Capital Improvement Fund balance of \$36,590 and \$8,892 in funds from the Parsonage Proceeds Fund which was transferred to the Capital Improvement Fund for future use. This project will reach fruition due, in large part, to generous donations from Zion members and a grant from the ELCA.

Various committee and financial reports were presented and accepted. Council President Troy Cording conducted the meeting efficiently and was thanked for his inspired leadership during his term of office. The meeting concluded with the installation of the newly elected Council members. Following the meeting, the Council met to elect officers for 2024. Elected were the following: President-Laura Rowe, Vice-President-Dean Schoen, Secretary-Michelle Larson. LeeAnn Limberg will continue as Treasurer. She, along with Office Administrator and Financial Secretary Marissa Tharp, were commended for their excellent and dedicated work.
