Some for whom cross-contamination could be lethal. For instance, dipping regular and gluten free into the same wine/grape juice. It eliminates the need for assistants to take extra steps when setting up the Lord's Supper. Lastly, using bread is a meaningful way that one or more siblings in Christ can share their God-given gifts and serve the church. It has come to our attention recently that a few folks have concerns about swallowing issues, so there will now also be gluten free wafers available.
